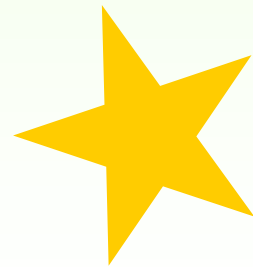

Students and student bodies are welcome to submit applications for funding for the organization of projects and programmes related to the HKU Centenary Celebration.

A proposal with a maximum of five A4 pages outlining the following information should be included:

- Objectives and description of the project in relation to HKU Centenary Celebration
- Activities (including date, time, duration and venue, etc.)
- How the project may engage the HKU community and the number of students that the project expects to engage
- CVs of main student organizers that highlight experience in similar events/activities
- Budget, including sources of income, donation or sponsorship

Subject: Funding for HKU100 Student Projects

Recently a few student groups have put forward ideas of activities for the celebration of HKU100. Some proposals are intended to be joint celebrations for the centenary of HKUSU as well.

The HKU100 Implementation Group is very encouraged by such enthusiasm and has therefore decided to set aside a budget, albeit small, for such purpose. On behalf of the Group, I am writing to invite students and student bodies to submit applications for funding for the organization of projects and programmes related to the HKU Centenary Celebration. Projects of various themes and formats (e.g., performances, publications, videos, etc.) may be accepted, except for service projects that fall into the objectives and scope of SERVICE 100 Fund (<http://cedars.hku.hk/Service100Fund>).

A proposal with a maximum of five A4 pages outlining the following information should be included:

- Objectives and description of the project in relation to HKU Centenary Celebration
- Activities (including date, time, duration and venue, etc.)
- How the project may engage the HKU community and the number of students that the project expects to engage
- CVs of main student organizers that highlight experience in similar events/activities
- Budget, including sources of income, donation or sponsorship

All proposed projects must start before Dec 31, 2012 and end within 2013. Each successful project will normally be provided with a funding of not more than HKD\$30,000. Outstanding projects may be included as official HKU Centenary Celebration projects. After the completion of the project, students are required to submit a full report.
