

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Eligible Participant

- 1. Students (undergraduate / postgraduate) studying in the universities and other tertiary institutions in Hong Kong
- 2. All nationalities are eligible
- 3. Expected size of the Participant Group (2025 session): 25 persons
- 4. Engineering and non-engineering students are welcome!
- 5. Medium of communication and instruction: English
- 6. Must be able to participate in the entire program.

Programme Fee

The participant is required to pay for part of the cost of the entire Programme. The tentative fees are below:

Application Fee: Nil.

Programme Fee: HK\$9,680/person# [participants are encouraged to seek for funding / subsidiary for

the programme fee from the universities they are studying]

Refundable Deposit: HK\$500/person (refund to the participant who completed the entire Programme)

Note:

- a) # The fee include the participation of all training and workshop activities in Hong Kong, local visit and community services daytrip participations in Hong Kong (exclude local transportation and meals), once exploration & service trip in Malaysia (include flight tickets, accommodation, transportation, meals, entrance fee to visiting places, group travel insurance, but exclude passport and immigration visa expenses).
- b) Payment shall be made after application and successful interview. Students may seek for partial sponsorship for the programme fee from the University at which the applicant is studying.

Grading System and Certification:

- Program deliverables will not be graded. We encourage proactive participation and interactions amongst students, mentors and tutors.
- To certify the successful completion of the Program, the participant shall complete the local activities and overseas exploration and service trip and 85% of the rest of Program contact hours. A Certificate of Completion will be awarded for successful completion.

General Terms & Conditions:

- Once the interview is successful, Formal Application Form shall be submitted together with the fee (ATM slip) for payment verification, otherwise, the application is treated as invalid.
- Once application is confirmed, the paid programme fee will not be refunded under any circumstance.
- 3. Engineers Without Borders (Hong Kong) Ltd. (EWB-HK) reserves the right to change the content, speaker, visiting venue, date and time of the Programme and trip details.
- 4. The basic accommodation for the participant is in the form of shared twin/group room for hotel or hostel subject to trip itinerary and service location.
- 5. EWB-HK will provide group travel insurance for the overseas trip at the specified time period. The group travel insurance will be valid for the participants participating in the group activities only. The Applicant may be able to purchase his / her own additional travel insurance. EWB-HK will not be responsible for the result and coverage of insurance compensation.
- 6. Passport and Visa for entry to the visiting country shall be at the participants' own cost.
- Certain risks exist in overseas activities. The participant shall gauge his / her own affordable risk, personal health conditions, age before participating activities. The decision is solely responsible by the participant.
- 8. The participant is recognized as a volunteer of EWB-HK and the participant shall abide by the Code of Conduct outlined in the EWB-HK Member and Volunteer Handbook.
- 9. The participant shall grant the right for EWB-HK using the photos and videos taken by EWB-HK during the entire program activities for the future promotion and communication usages.



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
